There was a request to allow chickens on property at 960 Pearl Street. Code of Ordinances, Chapter 55 Animal Protection and Control, 55.05 states "It is unlawful for a person to keep livestock within the City except by written consent of the Council. Motion by Slack, second by Lamphier to send written consent to property owner that chickens shall be penned or fenced no closer than 20' to residences other than the residence on the premises, no more than 6 chickens are permitted on the premise, and waste disposal plan is in place. All ayes; motion carried.

Fireman Lamphier reported the fire department had been on 5 medical, 1 fire, and 1 mutual aid since last meeting. The department would be hosting Livestock Truck Rollover Training on February 17th at 6 pm. Mayor Cook reported on the Buchanan County Landfill Commission meeting he attended where FY26 assessment would remain at \$1 per capita and raises were given to landfill employees. The Buchanan County Assessor is retiring so a committee was formed to interview for his replacement. He presented information on pickleball courts and grant opportunities along with the SWCD tree order. He is still working with Bush Street property owner nuisance. Habitat for Humanity Representative, Brenda Schmidtke, will be available in the Community Room on Wednesday, February 26th at 1:00

pm for anyone interested with help with home repairs. Mayor Cook also reported City owned the Church Street property and now working on the second one.

Motion by Lamphier, second by Adams to approve Public Works Director vacation. All ayes; motion carried.

Motion by Lamphier, second by Slack to approve law contract for FY26 in the amount of \$25,740, a per capita rate of \$60.00 (based on 2020 census figures of 429). Ayes: Lincoln, Adams, Slack, & Lamphier. Motion carried as Resolution 25-01.

Motion by Lincoln, second by Lamphier to adopt Resolution 25-02 for codification services to update Code of Ordinances for City of Lamont. All ayes; motion carried. Motion by Slack, second by Lincoln to approve the online codification costs. All ayes; motion carried.

Motion by Slack, second by Lincoln for Mayor to discuss speed zone changes on Highway 187 city limits with the lowa DOT. All ayes; motion carried.

Budget proposal for FY26 was reviewed. Motion by Slack, second by Lincoln to set public hearing for the purpose of considering the consolidated general fund tax levy for the City's fiscal year 2025-2026 budget for 6:00 pm on Wednesday, April 2nd. Ayes: Lamphier, Adams, Lincoln, & Slack. Motion carried as Resolution 25-03.

City Clerk reported Spring Clean Up Day is April 5th. Items need to be curbside by 6:00 am. Mayor Cook will contact Schafer's Iron & Metal from Rowley for two dumpsters, one for appliances and one for metals. No tvs, computers or electronics. Residents will have to contact City Hall to pay \$20.00 per item for Kluesner Sanitation to pick up on regular garbage day.

Motion by Slack, second by Lamphier to adjourn. All ayes; motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:17 pm.
