

A special meeting of the Lamont City Council was held Wednesday, April 22, 2026. Mayor Cook called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Present: Adams, Devlin, Lamphier, Lincoln, & Slack.

Motion by Lamphier, second by Devlin to approve the agenda. All ayes; motion carried.

Deputy Tyler Klenzman reported the Buchanan County Sheriff's Department logged 53 hours during March with calls for service being dog complaints, assault, and suspicious people.

Mayor Cook opened public hearing for the FY27 Budget proposal. No one appeared for or against said proposal. No comments written or oral had been received. Mayor Cook closed the public hearing. Motion by Slack, second by Lincoln to approve the budget proposal for FY27. Ayes: Adams, Devlin, Lamphier, Lincoln, & Slack. Motion carried as Resolution 26-15.

Mayor Cook reported he had been dealing with dog complaints and nuisance properties. He was sending out volunteer appreciation letters to the different boards and organizations in the area. He was having a Volunteer Recognition at Common Grounds at 10:00 am on Saturday, May 2nd. Letter went out with utility billing for residents to send in their choices for volunteers to recognize and if you want City to maintain noon and six whistles, only keep noon or six or stop both. Lamont will be hosting the BCEDC meeting on April 28th. EBTC is looking at another location for their box as City was not going to pay to have an easement set up and/or survey for property lines.

No show for dog complaint at 775 Prospect Street.

Public Works Director presented the FY27 Street Repairs project worksheet from Prairie Road Builders. He suggested seven areas to be done totaling around \$24,000. Motion by Slack, second by Lincoln to approve FY27 Street Repairs. All ayes; motion carried. Public Works Director reported he was still waiting on Oasis to repair pipe at Bush and Albert Streets. He started discharging lagoon early from all the rain.

Motion by Devlin, second by Adams to accept NBI Engineering Services, LLC proposal for \$2250.00 for Bridge Inspection Services and \$600.00 for SNBI Data Population Services. All ayes; motion carried as Resolution 26-16.

Motion by Lamphier, second by Lincoln to approve maintenance agreement for Kyocera printer with Office Towne. All ayes; motion carried as Resolution 26-17.

Motion by Lamphier, second by Devlin to adjourn. All ayes; motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:37 pm.
